A Greek Odyssey

The *Odyssey* (Ὀδύσσεια) is one of two major ancient Greek epic poems attributed to Homer. It is, in part, a sequel to the *Iliad*, the other work traditionally ascribed to Homer. The poem is fundamental to the modern Western canon. Indeed it is the second—the *Iliad* being the first—extant work of Western literature. It was probably composed near the end of the eighth century BC, somewhere in Ionia, the Greek-speaking coastal region of what is now Turkey.



To start – 'Odysseus' the main character

Χωριάτικη – A Greek salad of vine ripened tomatoes, cucumber, olives, extra virgin olive oil accompanied with grilled Cyprus haloumi, cracked pepper and garlic bread – very clean and healthy.



The main event – 'Homer' Odysseus's creator

Κοτόπουλο με Ξερά σύκα - Chicken with figs accompanied by a beetroot / bean salad drizzled with **Σκορδαλιά** a garlic sauce (skordalia).



To top it off – 'Penelope' Odysseus's wife

Μπακλαβάς - Baklava Layers of filo pastry, alternated with layers of chopped nuts and raisins accompanied by smooth Extra Virgin Olive Oil Icecream.



And the finale – 'Telemachus' Odysseus's son

Ελληνικός καφές – a choice of very dark and sweet Greek coffee or tea served with traditional Greek biscuits.
